### 1) webIRB processes to support new UCLA policies 916 & 917

- The Vice Chancellor for Research and Creative Activities sent out a [BruinPost on July 18, 2022](#) announcing two new policies. For details on those policies, see [Policy 916](#) & [Policy 917](#).
- To facilitate implementation of these policies for human subjects research, [ORIS](#) has developed two new functions in the webIRB system:
  - ***These functions will be implemented in webIRB starting July 22, 2022***
  - 1) An automatic check for GCP training for research staff on projects that meet the [NIH definition of a clinical trial](#). This training check will work just like the automatic check for human subjects (HS) training that was [rolled out in July of 2021](#).
    - As a reminder, the [IRB accepts GCP training or HS training to meet the HS training requirement](#).
  - 2) Providing a sequential review by the [SRC](#), when applicable, **before** IRB review.
